

# Countertops

Choosing the material that suits your cooking style is the first step to a functional kitchen. This is, after all, where the magic happens.



### QUARTZ

Best for the low-fuss cook, quartz requires no sealing or polishing and has double the impact resistance of natural stone, but it's still a bit sensitive to heat, so hot cookware shouldn't be set directly on it. It's a blend of natural stone and synthetic resins. Where to buy it: Caesarstone, Cambria. Silestone.



### LAMINATE

This nonporous acrylic comes in endless looks, so it's ideal for those who want to go wild with colors and patterns.

"It can shape itself into any design concept," says Gerri

Chmiel of Formica. New

technology has made it tougher, but laminate is still a budget option. Where to buy it: Corian, Formica,

Wilsonart.



### **BUTCHER BLOCK**

Calling all minimalists: Food can be prepped directly on the surface of a butcherblock counter. An occasional oiling is worth it if you love the warm, rustic look. Use a special finish to make the surface more water- and heat-resistant.

Where to buy it: Grothouse, John Boos & Co.



#### CONCRETE

For a distinctly industrial look, there's concrete, which can be poured to suit or purchased precast. While obviously durable, concrete stains easily and is not for perfectionists (but a sealant will minimize this!). Cost-wise, it's cheaper than marble but pricier than laminate. Where to buy it: Visit concretenetwork.com to find a supplier.



## Tile

There's a reason it's the most popular backsplash: Tile is tough and adds tons of texture and color.

## The Best Basic: Subway

Available for as little as \$1 per square foot, this classic option is still a huge favorite. And it's versatile: Just swap up the pattern.



### **Basket Weave**

Stack two horizontal tiles next to two vertical tiles for a geometric twist.



### this tilted stack will give your kitchen a whole new angle.



### **Vertical Stack Bond**

Surprisingly unexpected for being such a simple deviation from the horizontal norm.

## Get the **Right Grout**

White is the most obvious choice, but "there's an entire grout spectrum out there," savs Jake Rodehuth-Harrison of ETC.etera. Take your pick.



White The go-to grout color, bright white will stand out against everything but white tile.




### Neutral

For grout that disappears, use a neutral that complements the tile pattern.



#### Dark

Inkier pigments can contrast or blend inand are easier to keep clean than light ones.



### Color

To embolden plain tile, pick a bold huegreen! rose!-for an unexpected twist.

### **Beyond** the **Backsplash**

Three genius ways to get a little more tile into your kitchen.



#### **COVER A COUNTER**

Companies like DTile (which makes curved tiles for edges) are bringing this back. Upside: retro look! Downside: re-grouting.



#### **OVERHAUL A FLOOR**

If you want to inject more color or pattern into your kitchen, skip hardwood, linoleum, or concrete and go with allover tile on the floor.



#### **HIDE A HOOD**

No bulky appliances here! With tiles stretching seamlessly from wall to wall, the hood blends right in for a clean aesthetic.
